Native vegetation provides an important source of food, shelter and places for our birds to breed. Private land is becoming increasingly important as a refuge for birds so what we protect as landowners can make a difference to the survival of a species. Julie will talk about the importance of native trees and plants as habitat for the Glossy Black Cockatoo, Gang-Gang Cockatoo and Swift Parrots. Julie is a local landowner who is managing a property for conservation.

Dr Susan Rhind - Biologist

The when, where and why of nest boxes and whether they help conserve wildlife. Learn how to make and install boxes, be given examples for species that occur in the Congo/ Bingi area and tips on looking after the habitat of the animals that use the boxes. Examples of different nest boxes will be shown on the day.

Murray Ellis - Zoologist

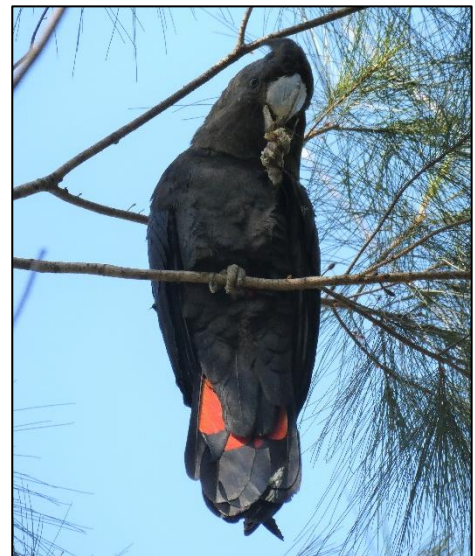
Cameras for wildlife - what's available and how to use them.
